Did you know.....

main attraction is not its' flowers, but its' leaves (bracts)? The flowers (cyathia) are the yellow clustered buds in the center.

native to southern Mexico where they bloom in December. They are referred to as "La Flora de la Nochebuena" or "Flower of the Holy Night". They have been used for centuries in that country to decorate churches.

....... in the wild, poinsettia plants can grow up
to 12 feet tall. They are
used sometimes in Mexico and Hawaii as hedges.

more than 100 varieties of
poinsettias in a large array
of colors such as white,
orange, and pink. Red, or

...... they are originally named for Dr. Joel Poinsett, an amateur botanist, who introduced the shrub to the U.S. after a trip to Mexico.

This outstanding variety is one of the whitest on the market. Large, pointed bracts are sure to impress.



Orange Glow

Add 2" to 3" of organic material to your vegetable beds. Use **Sheep, Peat and Compost** or **Organic Compost.** These organic products are locally produced and will improve your garden soil.

NOW IS THE TIME

Apply *Tree Wrap* around Halloween and remove it about Easter. Deciduous trees need to be wrapped for the first 6-7 years after planting.

Mulch roses and perennial beds with *Cedar Mulch*, *Gorilla Hair* or *Soil Conditioner/Soil Pep*. This is done to protect your plants by keeping the soil stable through the winter.

Plan to water your lawn, trees and shrubs every 4-5 weeks through the winter. Water on a day when the temperature is 40°F or higher.

Whether you're growing houseplants or herbs, we have everything you need to keep your gardening passion going indoors this winter, including organic fertilizers, grow lights and soil.
