#### A SYMBOL OF PEACE

There are many meanings to the Olive tree. It is a symbol of friendship and reconciliation, cleansing, healing, light, victory, richness and above all a sign of peace. Here at *The Flower Bin* we have 5 different varieties growing.



- First, Arbequina olive. This variety produces black olives as early as the second year. It is self-fertile, and drought resistant. Olives emerge green, transitioning to pink, and are ready to pick once they've turned black.
- ◆ **Second**, Leccino olive. This variety is the primary cultivar for olive oil production. Known for its Tuscan origins and delicate flavor profile. It is not selfpollinating and requires a pollinator. The olives emerge purple/black and are ready to pick once they've turned purple/green.

Arbequina

- ◆ *Third*, Chemlali olive. This variety is from Tunisia off the African coast of the Mediterranean Sea. It doesn't require a pollinator as it is self-fertile, but it will produce more if near one. Olives emerge green changing to a dark purple/black fruit that is slightly smaller, but full of rich nutty flavor, with a hint of fruity flavor.
- Fourth, Manzanillo olive. This variety is ultra-drought tolerant easy to grow, and self-fertile. Excellent quality fruit. Famous for rich black olives that can be pickled or pressed for oil. The fruit emerges green and transitions to a dark purple/black.
- *Fifth*, Coratina olive also known as 'Racioppa di Corato'. This variety originates in the Italian Province of Apulia. It is self-fertile, fall fruiting, and very productive. Oil is of excellent quality. Fruit emerges green and is ready to harvest when they are a red wine color.

Olive trees are not hardy here and must be inside during the winter. The holiday season is a great time to acquire an Olive tree for yourself or give one as a gift! Come see our selection!

Frasier Fir Uniformly pyramid shape, dark bluegreen in color and good needle retention.



**Noble Fir** Symmetrical, dense, with a deep bluish green color. Long needles are four-sided and twist upward.



Nordmann Fir Full with dark, green glossy, upper surface needles with a silvery white under surface. Needles are flat.

#### **NOW IS THE TIME**

- ◆ Add 2" to 3" of organic material to your vegetable beds. Use Sheep, Peat and Compost or Compost. These products are locally produced and will improve your garden soil.
- ◆ Apply *Tree Wrap* around Halloween and remove it about Easter. Deciduous trees need to be wrapped for the first 6-7 years after planting.
- Mulch roses and perennial beds with *Cedar Mulch*, *Gorilla Hair* or *Soil Conditioner/Soil Pep*. This is done to protect your plants by keeping the soil stable through the winter.
- ◆ Plan to water your lawn, trees and shrubs every 4-5 weeks through the winter. Water on a day when the temperature is 40°F or higher.
- Whether you're growing houseplants or herbs, we have everything you need to keep your gardening passion going indoors this winter, including unique pottery, organic fertilizers, grow lights and soil.
