Are you looking to create some additional balance and structure for your already existing burning bushes, ninebark, barberry, or Elderberry? Adding asters, rudbeckia, or sedums can help bring a pop of color as well as assist in creating that structure. Agastache, Mohave sage or the Autumn Sapphire Sage are hidden treasures that are often overlooked but are a wonderful low water option that provide late fall blooms and color. Mugo pines or Spartan Junipers not only create winter interest but a place for the lady bugs to lay their eggs through the seasons. BONUS!!



August lawn and garden tasks

Help your lawn recover from summer's heat. Use granular *Revive* to encourage strong root development and optimize water usage. Next, apply *Natural Guard HuMic*, improve soil structure and increase nutrient uptake.

Plan for cool weather vegetables. Beans, radishes, lettuce, kale, spinach and many more cool weather crops can be planted from seed or plant starts, for late season harvest.

September lawn and garden tasks

Seed or over-seed your lawn. Stop in. We'll help you select the right seed for your lawn.

Apply *ferti•lome Winterizer* fertilizer. Your lawn will store the nutrients for a strong start next spring.

October lawn and garden tasks

Test your garden soil. We have do-it-yourself kits, and we have a handout with directions on how to send your soil samples to the Colorado State University testing lab. Bring us the results and we'll help you decide what to do.

Add organic material to your tomato and vegetable beds every fall. We have locally produced, bagged soil amendments. Water! Well hydrated trees, shrubs and perennials are better equipped to deal with winter temperature swings.

Plan to clean your vegetable beds thoroughly. Leaving vegetation and debris in the garden provides shelter for many insects and diseases.

Gardening doesn't stop in the fall. You're always welcome to bring your lawn, garden, and houseplant questions to our Diagnostic Center. We'll identify the problem and offer you solutions. This is a free service we offer our customers year-round.
