

And so, the season changes and we adapt. You can bring in herbs to grow through the winter in your kitchen so you can easily grab fresh basil, oregano, sage, thyme, or rosemary while you are cooking. Many herbs do very well growing in a sunny window or under a grow light. We have herb starts year-round so you can always create a special indoor herb garden. Herbs such as thyme, oregano, sage, mint, and rosemary can also be grown from cuttings from established outdoor herb plants. Or you can pick up already planted herb gardens here at *The Flower Bin*. In November, we will have special gardens of herbs used in Thanksgiving and Christmas cooking. And this year we will have a new selection of fragrant and beautiful scented geraniums and nasturtiums. They add color and wonderful scents to your home. So enjoy the change in the weather and start creating your indoor garden.

What to do now?

- Keep your lawn, trees, shrubs, and perennials well hydrated.
- During the winter, plan to water every 4-5 weeks, on a day when the temperature is 40°F or higher.
- Gather the autumn leaves from the yard and layer them on your garden bed.
- Next, add 2" 3" of Earth Essentials **Sheep, Peat and Compost** or **Organic Compost.** This will help replenish and protect the soil through the winter.
- Apply *Tree Wrap* around Halloween and remove it about Easter.
- Deciduous trees need to be wrapped for the first 6-7 years after planting.
- Mulch roses and perennial beds with Soil Pep.
- This is done around **Thanksgiving** and serves to protect your plants by reducing moisture loss and keeping the soil stable through the winter.

Whether you are growing houseplants or herbs, succulents, or cacti, we have everything you need to keep your gardening passion going indoors this winter, including unique pottery, organic fertilizers, plant grow lights, gardening tools, and soil.

Plant Symbolism

Throughout history across the world plants have gone beyond the limits of cultural and linguistic boundaries making them universal icons. Because of this, plants are rich in symbolism. Here are some of the meanings behind some of our favorite houseplants commonly used for the Christmas season.

- The **Norfolk Island Pine** represents **peace** and **harmony** between people and the natural world. As well as **resilience** and **adaptability**.
- The **Lemon Cypress** symbolizes the **uplifting** of the human spirit and the possibility of **eternal life**. Also, **transition**, signaling the end of a major phase of life and the transition into a world of new possibilities.
- The Olive Tree's symbolic meaning is vast, with its timeless appeal. Representing peace, hope, friendship, immortality, strength and courage, beauty and clarity, wealth and prosperity, rebirth and regeneration.
- Anthurium is rich in symbolism, signifying hospitality, abundance, positivity, love and passion, motherly love (pink anthurium), innocence and purity (white anthurium), good luck and protection, and long-lasting love and friendships.
