Spring! A time for renewal and rejuvenation, not just for outdoor plants but for indoor plants as well. It is an ideal time of year to re-pot root bound plants. Choose a pot that is two inches bigger than the current pot, and that has proper drainage. Use indoor potting soil, The Flower Bin Potting Soil is a great choice. Always water your plant after re-potting it. The growing season is upon us, and it is important to give your plants the nutrients they need. Choose a good fertilizer for indoor plants such as Jack's Houseplant Special and follow the directions to make sure you are feeding the



proper amount. Now is also the time for shaping your plants, give them a trim according to how you would like them to be shaped, if the vines are too long or the they are too tall, cut them, and do it with confidence. It promotes bushier growth. If you would like you can put your cuttings in water and propagate them! Give your plants a cleaning. Dampen a cloth and gently wipe off any dust that has accumulated. Keep in mind with the Jacks longer days and warmer temperatures your plants may need to be watered more

frequently so make sure to check them more often. With care and nurturing

your plants can really begin to thrive this **Spring!**
